US renews commitment to supporting holding Libya elections in December



The United States (US) renewed commitment to supporting the holding of elections on December 24 and called for the withdrawal of foreign forces and mercenaries from Libya.

This statement was made by the US Deputy Secretary of State, Wendy Sherman, added on Twitter after meeting the American special envoy and ambassador in Libya, Richard Norland, on Tuesday.

initiative for stability in Libya that will be officially presented to the Berlin II Conference on June 23.

In an opening speech at the Qatar-hosted meeting, Al-Mangoush said the initiative is based on full implementation of ceasefire and setting a clear deadline for the withdrawal of foreign forces and mercenaries, reopening the coastal road, unifying military and other state sovereign institutions.

She said Libya is going through a new phase with a new executive authority that is working to achieve peace, use dialogue to resolve conflicts and prepare for December elections, hoping that this new phase has ended the disagreements regarding Libya among Arab League members.

Al-Mangoush said the settlement process is facing lots of challenges but Libya will implement the roadmap of the Libyan Political Dialogue Forum in full, saying her government prioritizes sovereignty, exit of foreign forces and mercenaries as well as achieving national reconciliation, which has already started by the Presidential Council's decision to form High National Reconciliation Commission.

Libyan PM reiterates government support for Public Prosecution



Libyan Prime Minister Abdul-Hamid Dbeibah said his government will support the Public Prosecution with necessary funds to allow its work to continue effectively.

In a meeting with the Attorney General, Al-Siddiq Al-Sour on Tuesday, Dbeibah said his government is keen on receiving reports from the Public Prosecution to combat financial and administrative corruption at the public sector, reviewing as well the challenges facing enforcing laws and the solutions to end them.

The two officials discussed as well working as per national and international standards regarding human rights, including at rehabilitation facilities, as Al-Sour hailed the seriousness of the Government of National Unity to support the work of the Public Prosecution and briefing the Attorney General's Office about certain administrative abnormalities.

PC and GNU discuss the Berlin Conference II

The President of the Presidential Council (PC), Mohammed Menfi held talks with the Prime Minister of the Government of National Unity (GNU), Abdel Hamid Dbeibah, on Monday June 14, regarding their participation in the Berlin II conference, scheduled to take place at the end of this month.

The media office of the PC indicated that both sides consulted on various regional matters of concern to major Libyan issues, with the meeting also touching on a number of service files related to relieving the suffering of Libyan citizens, such as electricity and provision of Coronavirus vaccine.

The meeting also covered the military and security situation in the country, along with issues relating to terrorism, however it also reviewed the latest developments in the tension surrounding security in the city of Ajilat and a number of other areas.

Sirte-Al-Jufra Operations Room discuss military developments with British Embassy



The Commander of the Sirte-Al-Jufra Operations Room, Ibrahim Bait Al-Mal, along with a number of his aides, held a meeting on June 14, with the British Ambassador to Libya, Nicholas Hopton, and the military attaché of the British Embassy in Libya, Colonel Mark Baffin, in Misrata.

According to a statement by the Operations Room, both the military and political developments in the country were discussed, most notably the presence of armed groups and their expansion from Sirte to Al-Jufra, in addition to the opening of the coastal road in the Sirte region, linking the east and west of the country.

The statement added that Hopton affirmed his country's position in support of military and political stability in Libya and the continuation of international efforts towards the withdrawal of foreign forces, led by the Russian Wagner group, along with the need for them and others to return back to where they came from, according to the statement.

NATO says committed to providing advice to Libya

NATO said in a statement Monday that Libya's crisis has direct effects on regional stability and the security of all allies, welcoming the progress made on the political level, including the endorsement of a new interim executive authority, and said it's committed to providing advice to Libyan institutions, upon their requests, in building defense and security apparatuses.

The statement hails UN efforts in supporting the Libyan-led and Libyan-owned political process that aims to unify institutions and achieve national reconciliation, calling on the Government of National Unity and House of Representatives to fulfill the requirements of for roadmap of the Libyan Political Dialogue Forum and lead the country to free and transparent elections.

NATO statement urged for full implementation of Security Council 2570 and 2571 resolutions and the ceasefire signed on October 23, 2020.

Ministry of Economy and Trade reviews targeted issues of 11th session of Libyan-Egyptian Higher Committee

The Undersecretary of the Ministry of Economy and Trade, Suhail Boushiha, has held discussions with the Department of International Cooperation in the Presidential Council, the Department of International Cooperation in the Ministry and representatives of the committee for ministries, government agencies and departments, in addition to the Libyan Central and Foreign Banks.

During the meeting, they reviewed the files and issues targeted in the meetings of the Libyan-Egyptian Higher Committee in its 11th session, which will be held during the coming period.

The attendees also discussed the bilateral agreements concluded between the two countries in all sectors and the possibility of evaluating and developing them, reviewing deficiencies in their implementation, especially the binding ones.

The meeting also pointed out to a number of outstanding issues and files between the two countries in several fields and ways to address them.

They also stressed the great interest in agreements that directly affect citizens related to "residence, work, movement and ownership" known as the Four Freedoms Agreement and the Agreement on the Transport of Goods and Passengers.



CBL discusses Libyan-Tunisian memorandum of agreement

The Governor of the Central Bank of Libya (CBL), Sadiq Al-Kabir, held discussions on Monday, with the Libyan Financial Information Unit and a number of advisors.

The meeting aimed to study the memorandum of agreement signed between the Libyan and Tunisian Customs to regulate the entry of goods imported from Tunisia through land ports under documentary credits in accordance with the publications of the Banking and Monetary Control Department at the CBL, according to the CBL media office.



Al-Raed discusses strengthening economic and trade cooperation with Italy

The President of the General Federation of Chambers of Commerce, Industry and Agriculture, Mohamed Al-Raed, held discussions with the Italian Ambassador to Libya, Giuseppe Buccino, on the outcomes of the visit of the Prime Minister of the Government of National Unity (GNU), regarding the economic features between both countries.

The meeting also covered the possibility of implementing various projects in the oil and gas sector, along with reactivating many suspended contracts with joint companies, including the haulage industry, in addition to implementing the contract to rebuild the Tripoli International Airport terminal.

This has been confirmed to reach completion within the next ten months, along with the implementation of completing sections of the highway, with bidding to take place for the most competent companies to complete the task.



Minister of Economy and Trade, Tunisian counterpart follow up preparations for Libyan-Tunisian Joint Committee meeting

The Minister of Economy and Trade, Mohammed Al-Hawij, and his Tunisian counterpart, Mohammed Boussaid, have reviewed preparations for the meeting of the Libyan-Tunisian joint committee during the coming period.

During the meeting, the two sides also reviewed the work of the technical committees to facilitate the movement of citizens, goods and services through all borders, following up what was recently agreed upon during the Tunisian Prime Minister's visit to Tripoli last May.



Libyan PM: We're working on meeting HoR remarks on budget bill

The Libyan House of Representatives (HoR) concluded budget endorsement session on Tuesday without approval, saying a new session will be held on June 29.

Sources from the HoR said the budget bill was sent to its planning and financial committee with a Government of National Unity's committee for providing the last remarks on the budget so the HoR can vote again late this month.

The HoR sent the budget bill for consideration to its planning and financial committee more than once and the government amended the bill, yet the HoR is still reluctant to approving it, which observers see as intentional prolongation.

The HoR suspended Monday the session over arguments that escalated to a fistfight between two members over the budget bill entanglement.

Dbeibah supports demands to raise salaries for medical sector and calls for viable solutions



Salary payment for the medical sector was at the centre of attention in the Prime Minister's meeting with the Health Minister and directors of medical centers and departments on Saturday.

He called on different areas in this sector to join efforts and ensure quality services to citizens, besides setting controls to determine the relationship between medical centers and public hospitals located in the same geographical scope.

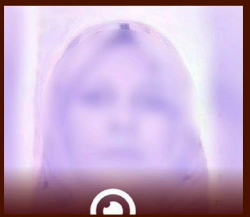
The workshop covered topics like how to set up e-learning classes and the benefits of this method in terms of time, effort, and cost savings "if an appropriate infrastructure is available."

Haftar's forces burn woman's hands in a Benghazi prison for her critique writing



A woman named Eftikhar Abu Draa has had her hands burnt at Kuwifa prison in Benghazi by elements loyal to Khalifa Haftar's forces, reported the Head of Victims Organization for Human Rights, Nasser Al-Hawari.

Al-Hawari said on Facebook that the woman has been in prison for three years and was first sentenced to death by a firing squad, then got her sentence reduced to ten years for the charges of "writing against Haftar and his crimes on social media".

He indicated that masked gunmen loyal to Haftar poured gasoline on the woman's hands and lit them up saying: "We will burn the hands that you use to write against the Field Marshal [Haftar]", according to Al-Hawari, who asked two days ago Benghazi security and military units to investigate the kidnap, shaving of hair and rape of another woman named Abeer Ahmed Omar.

Footage of the kidnappers was seen on social media showing one

of them shaving the woman's hair, which ignited anger in Libya with many people urging security forces to stop such crimes that have been oftentimes recurrent in Benghazi.

Al-Hawari urges security units to probe Benghazi's girl kidnap-rape incident



Legal activist, Nasser Al-Hawari, urged security and military units in Benghazi to probe "kidnap, shaving of hair and rape of a girl named Abeer Ahmed Omar."

Al-Hawari accused a militiaman loyal to Khalifa Haftar's forces in Benghazi, Ali Al-Ferjani, of being involved in this incident with three others, who all kidnapped the girl for three days.

He said they had shaved her hair and raped her then threw her on the street with no action from security forces.

Footage of the kidnappers was seen on social media showing one of them shaving the girl's hair, which ignited anger in Libya with many people urging security forces to stop such crimes that have been oftentimes recurrent in Benghazi.

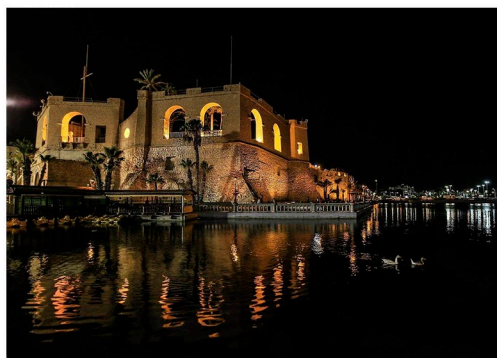

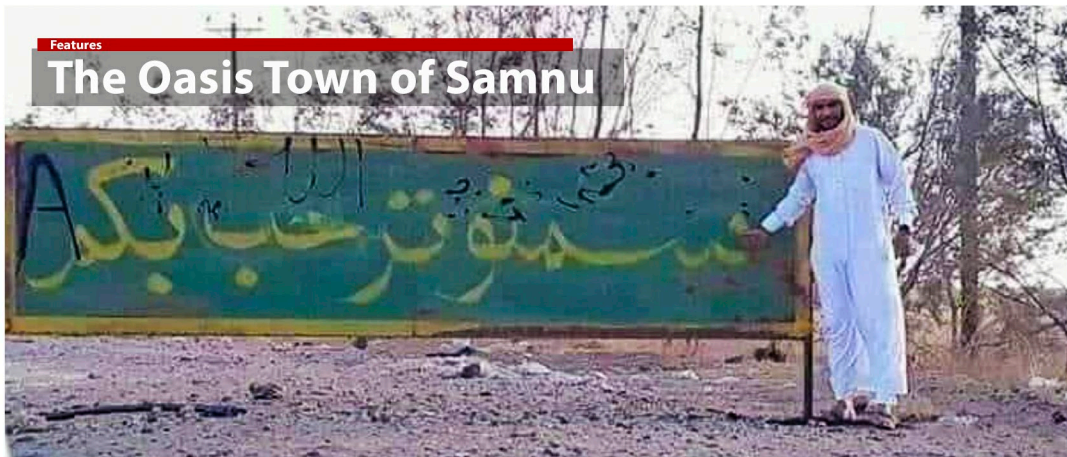

The Oasis Town of Samnu



The oasis Samnu is located northeast of Sabha, the capital of the south and the capital of Fezzan Province (southern Libya), at a distance of 60 km, and south of the oasis of El-Zeigin at a distance of 10 km, and a distance of 30 km from the oasis of Tamanhant. These oases (Samnu, El-Zeigin, and Tamanhant) form what is known as Wadi Al-Bawanis, which extends from Jufra in the north to Ghadwa and Tamsa in the south, and from Wadi Al-Kabeer separating the southeast and southwest of Libya in the east until Wadi Al-Shati and the administrative borders of Sabha in the west.

The town of Samnu is bordered on the west by sand dunes that extend for vast distances later to form a sea of sand "Zalaf" through the Tamanhant Oasis.

The kindness of its people for those coming from afar is uttered by the expressions of their faces that beat the cruelty of nature, the lack of water, the heat of summer, the bitter cold of winter, and the mess of the sand that is scattered by the winds of (Al-Qibli) coming from the south, where the vast desert extension of what is known as (the Great Desert).

Historically, it was linked to the transit desert caravan routes. It is at a distance of 100 km from the "Zuweila and Tamsa", the north-eastern end of Wadi Murzuq. Also, it is at a distance of 40 km from the Ashkadah Oasis, which represents the eastern end of Wadi Al-Shati.

This oasis is famous for its agriculture, which is the main source of income in it, as Samnu is one of the largest producers of agricultural products such as (tomatoes, potatoes, wheat, barley and other agricultural products).

The exact meaning of its name is not known. It is likely an Amazigh word, which means the pasture.
